# About Arquideas...

Arquideas is a community of students and young professionals working in the world of architecture and design whose main objective is to showcase the talent and creativity of its young members, thereby bridging the gap between the academic and professional spheres of architecture and design.

Through its competitions, Arquideas seeks to encourage its community to participate in current architectural discussion, generating a selection of quality proposals that can provide solutions to the different challenges set forth in the contests.

Not only are participants given the opportunity to present their proposals to society, they also become familiar with how competitions work, a format that is increasingly employed to award the most attractive professional commissions on an international level. Arquideas will exhibit the work presented in each competition on its website and publish the

results in international architecture journals, as well as on specialized websites and blogs, in order to disseminate the best proposals and provide publicity for their creators.

By disseminating the proposals presented in each competition, Arquideas provides participants with an opportunity to improve their CV by winning one of the prizes or honourable mentions awarded by a prestigious Jury.

## The competition...

Norway, together with Sweden, Finland and part of Russia, is one of the countries that form the Scandinavian Peninsula.

It is considered one of the most beautiful countries in the world thanks to its rugged nature with snaking glaciers, mountain areas in



the interior that resemble natural fortresses, rocky islands that emerge from the sea and waterfalls that emanate a sublime and savage energy.

Other natural wonders such as Aurora Borealis, the Midnight sun, the fjords and the tranquillity found in their national parks, showcase Norway's virtues.



Its geological formations are home to some of the most charismatic species of flora and fauna in Europe, with polar bears, reindeer, musk oxen, lynxes and even orcas that venture upriver through the fjords, in one of the country's most impressive natural spectacles.

Because of Norway's high latitude, there are large seasonal variations in daylight. From late May to late July, the sun never completely descends beneath the horizon in areas north of the Arctic Circle, hence Norway's description as the "Land of the Midnight sun". Conversely, from late November to late January, the sun never rises above the horizon in the north, and daylight hours are very short in the rest of the country.

Norway's main attraction, speaking in terms of natural beauty, resides in fjords. They form islands, islets and huge areas of land surrounded by water.

Over a period of 2.5 million years, the U-shaped valleys were carved out of the ground during a succession of glacial cycles. In other words, the fjords were shaped by the glaciers. The fjords were created by massive glaciation that went below sea level. The glaciers melting caused huge valleys that were flooded by salt water creating incredible situations and high cliffs with rivers that go deep into land. 'Fjord' is a Norwegian word that has gone international. It's an ancient Viking term related to the phrase for 'where you travel across' (der man ferder over)

Thanks to the warm Gulf Stream and air currents caused by the Coriolis force, the Norwegian fjords enjoy a relatively mild climate and remain virtually ice-free. Different activities can be enjoyed such as hiking, climbing, kayaking, and other ways of moving around. The fjords plunge to more than 1,300 metres under the sea, as it is the case of the Sognefjord. This makes navigation of big cruises possible.

Situated in south-western Norway, north-east of Bergen, Geirangerfjord and Nærøyfjord, set 120 km from one another, are part of the west Norwegian fjord landscape, which stretches from Stavanger in the south to Andalsnes, 500 km to the north-east.

In Gudvangen and Geiranger, two of the villages of Nærøyfjord and Geirangerfjord, are located the most popular cruise ports of Scandinavia.

In Geirangerfjorden, it is worth stressing the waterfalls called "The Seven Sisters", located near Knivsflå, an abandoned farm. They have a free fall that measures 250 metres. The water



flow depends on thaw and rain. These waterfalls are normally more visible during the greater period of snow melting, in May-July.

The two fjords, among the world's longest and deepest, are considered as archetypical fjord landscapes and among the most scenically outstanding anywhere. Their exceptional natural beauty is derived from their narrow and steep-sided crystalline rock walls that rise up to 1,400 m from the Norwegian Sea and extend 500 m below sea level. The sheer walls of the fjords have numerous waterfalls while free-flowing rivers cross their deciduous and coniferous forests to glacial lakes, glaciers and rugged mountains.

Remnants of old and now mostly abandoned transhumant farms add a cultural aspect to the dramatic natural landscape that complements and adds human interest to the area.

UNESCO has included Norway's fjords, exemplified by the Geirangerfjord and Nærøyfjord, in the World Heritage list.

The counterpoint to Norway's ever-present natural beauty is found in its vibrant cultural life.

Norwegian cities are cosmopolitan and its architecture showcases the famous Scandinavian flair for design.

## Objective of the competition

The objective of the present competition for students of architecture and young architects, Viewpoint of the Fjords (VOF), consists in proposing a space for contemplation and admiration of the environment that will produce an exchange between landscape and spectator. A space where nature plays a key role.



Landscape observation is the fundamental purpose of this architectural space. It must appreciate the virtues of the location and experiment new ways of contemplation.

Thanks to its privileged location, this new proposed space will become an international reference point for all visitors of this natural attraction.

VOF aspires to become the new meeting point for visitors and nature, a new place of understanding and an information point for hikers. In here, observation will become a unique sensory experience.

A unique and iconic reference space for visitors from all over the world that go to Norway looking for its natural wonders.

The proposal must offer a unique experience, assimilating the privileged environment where views play a key role for discovering and understanding natural wonders, and paying attention to sustainability and integration within the landscape.

In a country so full of world-famous iconic images, this new space for contemplation must become an architectural reference for Norway.



#### Location

VOF will be preferably located in the area of Geirangerfjord, next to Homlungsaetra area (600 m altitude), which is accessible through a path departing from Homlung. A place to contemplate the "Seven Sisters" waterfalls. However, if considered appropriate, participants can locate the proposal somewhere else in the fjords area.

The project can be freely developed in one or more locations of the area described in the attached documentation. There are no requirements concerning land use, every team or participant can freely develop their idea.



#### Call

This competition is open to international undergraduate and graduate students and recent graduate of architecture or related degrees, individually or in teams made up of a maximum of four (4) members.

Recent graduate means a person graduated within the two (2) years before the competition launching, this is, all graduated in 2016 or later.

Teams will pay a single registration fee, regardless of the number of team members. Each participant can only present one proposal, whether as an individual or part of a team.

This competition is closed to any person who participated in the elaboration of the competition or who has dependent personal or professional ties to the organization.

#### Queries

During the period indicated in the competition schedule that has been included in these Terms & Conditions, questions about this competition can be sent to competitions@arquideas.net.

Arquideas will respond to all of the questions posed during the established period and will publish answers to questions deemed to be of particular interest to all participants in order to improve the comprehension of the project and resolve doubts.

All the documentation needed to take part in the competition can be downloaded from the Arquideas web site www.arquideas.net throughout the registration period.

#### Documents to be submitted

Each participating team will submit a single panel a Din-A1format in vertical disposition, where the ideas of the project take shape.

Each panel must have in the upper right corner the proposal identification code generated during the registration process. Any proposal that does not have a visible ID code under the described conditions described shall be exempted from the selection process and annulled (Example: VOF 0000).



The documentation included on the panel is free and always focused on the better understanding of the proposal by the Jury. It is recommended to present the following documentation given below as a minimum documentation for the understanding of the project:

- Representative plans and elevations
- Characteristic section
- Perspectives or digital images
- Small explanatory report



All texts on the proposal must be in English or Spanish.

All the information sent out of the single Din-A1 panel will not be evaluated by the Jury.

Two (2) files of the proposal must be submitted:

- A\*.PDF file in a vertical Din-A1 format (594x841 mm) with a maximum recommended size of about 8 Mb.
- A \*.JPG version of the proposal to be viewed in the website with a maximum size of about 1,500px wide.

The proposals should be uploaded through the webpage www.arquideas.net before the deadline of the competition shown on these Terms & Conditions.

The deadlines are until 24:00hrs. (GMT+0:00 – London time). As it is an international competition, it is necessary to consider the time zone from which you participate.

# Criteria used to evaluate the proposals

The submitted projects will be evaluated by the Jury with the following considerations:

- The quality of the architectural proposal
- The ability to clearly express the project concept
- The project location selection
- The relationship between the proposal and the landscape
- Solutions provided for the proposed uses
- Sustainability and energy usage
