MOVE research on contemporary venice

PROJECT

The mechanical mobility in a particolar city like Venice makes up an important entity. Trains, imposing holiday cruisers, water-bus, trams on rail, the limen presence of cars cross the connection between land and water networks. Commuters and occasional passengers, atipical citizens and absent-minded tourist move and live the places of shifts and flows of persons.

Contrast between natural and artificial, effects due to the fast mobility and the perceptive conditions that check them, the problems cohesion of urban tissues, the depopulation of the town, the fascination of the planning of great infrastructures, the mobile equipments connected to advertising and commerce, to the most complex scenic itinerant machines are some potential subjects to investigate.

The workshop will offer some space to different photographic interpretations: the **representation of the town** and of the urban landscape, the **portrait** as research on identity and social relations, the description of the **industrial places** and of the world of work, the **personal story** through indications, signs and fragments.

He has worked on several projects which are revealing a sincere interest in human behaviour.



PROGRAM AND PURPOSE

The workshop aims to promote the culture of photography in Italy, and aims to provide participants with the conceptual and methodological tools necessary for the creation and implementation of a photographic project. A key part will be devoted to the most important aspects of the research and of the profession, such as the auto production of a portfolio: the planning phase, structuring and development of the narrative system, the care of the editing. Participants will develop their project in line with the themes of the workshop.

The program is structured in **three days** during which members will have the opportunity to interact constantly with Raimond Wouda 'till the composition of a photo sequence. The intention is also to transform the **photographic practice**, individual and often solitary, **into a tool that is based on mutual relate. Not only uni-directional expression of a series of content by the teacher, but an opportunity to dialogue and constructive criticism.** The goal is to create a unified body of work in which the views of individual participants, different in term of concepts, subjects, styles and techniques, become the preferred tool to explore the theme.

You can use both **analog** and **digital** equipment. A selection of photos of each individual member will be published in the following months in a section inside the contemporary photography magazine Landscape Stories.
