

OVERVIEW

The Course in Sustainable Participatory Design and Biourbanism brings together two critical dimensions of sustainability: citizens participation and biourbanism as new paradigm.

The course, delivered via the internet (videoconference), is the first to provide basic education in biourbanism.

The students following the course shall acquire a:

- general knowledge about Architecture and context in XX Century;
- general understanding of the participatory design (tools and methods)
- special and basically knowledge about biourbanism (principles and tools).

COURSE CONTENT

Ten intensive lectures — plus two electives workshops — are completed sequentially within the year 2012.

Lectures:

- Theory and context in the XX Century
- · Biourbanism. Basic skills
- Participatory design: Tools and methods
- Examples and best practices



INTERNATIONAL WORKSHOPS

The International Workshops are a two weeks, full-time programme consisting of challenging design studios, field study, seminars and lectures that emphasize the importance of both practice as well as theory. It offers participants a new theoretical approach to design urban environment based on biophilic and morphogenetic theories. Creative collaboration is encouraged with students working in distinct groups hailing from different countries.

Summer 2012: Participants not enrolled in the short course may register in individual workshop when space is available.

BIOURBANISM SCHOOL

Unique, dynamic, independent and international, Biourbanism School is much more than a school of architecture and urbanism. The school is the nexus of a global research network in Biourbanism for an human oriented architecture and urbanism. The Biourbanism' incarnations include a high-profile public events programme, lectures, symposia, seminars, conversations, research clusters and visits. Tutors, lecturers and critics include masters as well as practitioners pooled from diverse disciplines. All this takes place at the Biourbanism' newly consolidated campus home on its historic site in Artena and Norma (Rome).
